



Dreamers Dance Academy - IDTA Exam Session on 26th April 2026

We have had confirmation from the IDTA that our first exam session of the year can take place on Sunday 26th April. Not all students will take an exam on this date as this is only a session for Grade exams. Please take the time to read this letter as it includes vital information before registering your child before 13th March if they are participating in these exams.

Location

Who

Not all children are being entered for certain exams as some of our classes are working at different levels depending on when they joined the class. If your child is not sure if they are being entered, please don't hesitate to ask for clarification. The following exams will take place for the students who are ready:

Mini Stars Primary Ballet
Mini Stars Primary Tap
Lower Junior Grade 1 Ballet
Lower Junior Grade 1 Tap
Lower Junior Grade 1 Theatre Craft

Time:

An exam timetable will be issued nearer to the time of each exam session. Please keep an eye on your emails!

If you already have other commitments on this date, and you require either an early exam time or a late one, please make me aware so that I can factor this into the timetable. I can't promise that I will be able to accommodate your request, but I will do my best.

Cost:

Once the registration deadline has passed and I am aware of exactly who is entering their exams, I will process all exam payments through GoCardless which means you do not need to do anything. It is really important that you make me aware if your child is not doing their exams, or if they are selecting specific exams so that I don't incorrectly charge you. These are the individual charges for each exam:

Mini Stars Primary Tap- £34

Lower Junior Grade 1 Ballet- £39

Lower Junior Grade 1 Tap- £39

Lower Junior Grade 1 Theatre Craft- £39

Uniform

Please ensure you have all items required for the exams well in advance so that we have time to source the correct items before the exam day.

Ballet shoes (please ensure they have elastics fitted to prevent them slipping off) **Ballet shoes bought from Sainsburys/supermarkets are not real ballet shoes and must not be worn for an exam!**

Boys: Black cycling shorts, white t shirt, white ankle socks and black ballet shoes. These should be slim fitting.

Boys: same as ballet but with tap shoes

White socks, or may wear leggings over ballet tights to make changing easier.

Tap shoes (must be black) PLEASE CHECK THAT THEY HAVE BOTH TOE TAPS AND HEEL TAPS.

Grooming

Hair must be neatly groomed and secure enough to not fall out during the exam. I advise practising with hair before the exams to ensure that you have enough grips etc to hold the hair in place. Hair doughnuts can be used to create buns if your child has particularly long or thick hair. If not, a classical ballet bun should be created by twisting the hair around itself. Use lots of pins and grips to hold the hair securely in place. Hair nets are also useful to help keep the hair neat and in place. Please use lots of hairspray or gel to slick the hair back off the face. Fringes should also be gripped back. **No hair accessories can be worn for exams.** There is no need to wear makeup for an exam. (We save the glitz and glamour for the shows!).

Special Consideration

Special consideration can be made for dancers who have learning disabilities, special needs, illness or injury that may affect their ability to succeed in their exam. It is in place so that all children have equal opportunities. If you would like to submit a special consideration form for your child, please let me know as soon as possible so that all paperwork can be completed in time for the exam. Please note that the IDTA often requires doctors notes to accompany the special consideration request.

On the day

Dancers will be asked to arrive AT LEAST 25 MINUTES before their exam time (exam timetable will be released nearer the time). This is because the examiner could run early (very common) and your child could therefore enter their exam earlier than expected. At our last exam session however, the examiner was very thorough and ran considerably behind schedule! I'm very grateful for your patience on exam day if this happens to be the case as once the exams start, the time keeping is entirely out of my control.

Dancers must arrive FULLY READY for their first exam. I am going to do my best to arrange the timetable so that no clothing changes need to happen. At most, a change of shoes or adding leggings over the top of leotards etc is all that will be required. This is because there will be no waiting or changing area. I will use the small communal foyer just inside the green doors for shoe changes, but this is not suitable for clothing changes.

Parents will not be permitted to enter the studio, except from assisting children in the toilets. You will be requested to drop your child at the green door. You are welcome to wait in the car park (if there is good weather and the carpark is quiet, I will put some stools outside), or walk across the road to McDonalds etc but you won't be permitted to enter the building. We don't have the space for adults to congregate and the dancers will benefit from a quiet, fuss free environment prior to their exam. Minimal fuss and chaos is the best way for all children to prepare to minimise any pre exam nerves. It also ensures that the noise is kept down for those in their exam.

Between now and the exams, it is really important that all students are practising at home. We have limited time in class each week and so extra practising at home is only going to increase your child's confidence. For classes who would benefit, I will record and send home help videos.

ACTION REQUIRED:

- 1- Register via the website. If your child is **not** taking their exam, please let me know by
13th March 2026
- 2- Encourage practice at home.
- 3- Ensure that you have the correct uniform.
- 4- Keep an eye out for emails containing timetables nearer to the time.
